Mayor Stuart opened the November Council meeting by welcoming City Councilor Barb Hilty to deliver the Invocation which was followed with the Pledge of Allegiance. The Mayor then asked the Councilors to give their committee reports. Then the Council took action on the following agenda items:

- 1 A Public Hearing to hear a request from Kim & Tim Smith at 5817 Foothill Blvd, Grants Pass, to hook up the utility services within the Urban Growth Boundary and sign a Consent to Annex and Deferred Compliance Agreement was tabled until the applicant can provide construction drawings.
- 2 Adopted an Ordinance amending Rogue River

Municipal Code $\underline{17.10.010}$, $\underline{17.130.010}$ and $\underline{17.130.020}$ for the City of Rogue River, Oregon.

- **3** Adopted an Ordinance adopting a Purchasing Policy and repealing Ordinance No. <u>05-323-O</u>, also known as Rogue River Municipal Code 31.10 for the City of Rogue River, Oregon.
- 4 Approved a new Oregon Liquor Control Commission Liquor License Application for Kawa Sushi and Asian Bistro at 121 Depot Street, Rogue River, Oregon.

Remember that bags are always available at City Hall, just come down to City Hall and pick them up.


Please be patient with our Public Works Crew. This time of the year is always hectic for everyone and being under staffed has been a challenge.

You can find information about installing a fence, building in the riparian areas of your property, garage sale regulations, opening a new business in town or working from home, regulations about nuisances, vehicle and traffic regulations, street, sidewalk and public places, rules and regulation for our parks, building and construction codes, abatement of dangerous buildings, flood damage prevention, everything you want to know about creating a subdivision, and then there is the zoning regulations broke down by property designation, off street parking and loading, recreational vehicle parks, erecting a sign, storm and surface water management, erosion prevention and sediment control, the regulations for public utilities and services, water emergencies. These are just some of the rules and regulations that the City Council and staff work with to protect you the citizens of Rogue River. Check it out, you'll be amazed how the City works and why the staff makes the decisions they do!

PROTECTING YOUR HOME AGAINST FROZEN & BURST PIPES

Identify the main water shut-off to your home or business and try it before you have to use it. There should be a valve behind the water meter at the street. Call City Hall if you need assistance in locating your shutoff valve. We can be reached at 541-582-4401.

- Turn off outdoor faucets and disconnect hoses.
- Turn off and drain irrigation sprinklers and supply lines.
- Insulate pipes in your breezeway, crawl spaces and attic.
 These exposed pipes are the most susceptible to freezing.
 If your system is vulnerable, turn on faucets (both hot and cold) until they trickle slowly if you have any concern about pipes freezing.
